

# How to Access AP Marks Online

This year no AP mark reports will be sent directly to students as has been done in the past. Students can access their AP marks online through the College Board website. Students are asked to create a **College Board** account by following the instructions below. It is very simple and straight forward. ## 1. Sign up for an account — it's free!

Get your **College Board account now** so you'll be ready to get your scores online in July. You will not receive your scores in the mail, and you'll need this account to access them. Once you sign up, emails will also keep you updated on how and when to access your scores.

You may already have an account if you ever registered for the SAT or participated in other College Board programs. Try **signing in at [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org)** to find out.

### 2. Remember this information

*OR*

- **Your student identifier (student ID number)** if you put it on your AP answer sheet at exam time

You will receive an email after the exam period letting you know how and when to access your scores.
